COLONEL HANS RAJ RUHIL Pro Vice Chancellor Mansarovar Global University Madhya Pradesh

Colonel H.R.Ruhil currently working as Pro Vice-Chancellor, Mansarovar Global University, M.P. is a dynamic personality with multi-faceted experience in Academics and Defence. In the field of education, he was honored with Letter of Appreciation from the Chief of Army Staff for his contribution in the field of Education in Army Public Schools from 2005 to 2009. In the field of Higher Education, while working as Pro Vice Chancellor of Singhania University for six years, Colonel Ruhil was honored with the title of Siksha Seva Ratna on the Republic Day in 2018. He was also honored by AVVARE Education HUB for his dedicated efforts in Upliftment of Educational Standards of Higher Education and Enlightening the Life of Youth from Financially Weaker Sections Belonging to Rural Areas with Outcome Oriented Education.

Col. Ruhil's profile has a stint of over 38 years of Military service wherein he participated in a number of military operations including the 1971 war against Pakistan. In June 1984, the then Prime Minister, Mrs. Indira Gandhi visited him in the Army Hospital where Colonel Ruhil was battling for life after he was grievously wounded while fighting against terrorists. Right in the hospital the Prime Minister personally handed over Col Ruhil, a signed letter of her appreciation for his daring acts against terrorist showing valour and bravery, unmindful of his personal safety, despite having been grievously wounded. Colonel Ruhil is a recipient of 16 medals for his various actions of bravery and good service to the nation, while in the Army.

Dr. Arti: What inclined you to adopt this career?

Col. Ruhil: I always had an interest in the field of education. However, destiny took me to serve the nation through Indian Army. After retirement from the Army, I decided to join the profession of my interest – the field of education.

Dr. Arti : Because this a very responsible task, how do you manage?

Col. Ruhil: Every job is a position of responsibility. One has to be sincere and dedicated to the profession.

Dr. Arti : What is the biggest challenge at your job? How do you approach them?

Col. Ruhil: Managing the teams that have diverse components and interests, is challenging. But life would have been dull, indeed, if there were no challenges. when the going gets tough, the tough get going; and I think I am reasonably tough.

Dr. Arti : In your experience what is the key to developing a good team?

Col. Ruhil: Some aspects that must be kept in mind while developing a good team are:-

- > Trust among the team members.
- > Good and clear communications.
- ➤ Delegation of responsibility and taking responsibility for anything going adverse in the team.
- Encourage free expression of opinion by all. But one a decision is taken, all most follower the decision, irrespective of personal views.
- > Loyalty to the organization and welfare of students must be above all other considerations.

Dr. Arti : Give me an example of when you thought outside of the box. How did it help your Faculty?

Col. Ruhil: Thinking out of fox is for independent enterprises and trainees. We, in the University, ought to follow the broad guidelines of the National Education Policy 2020 and the provisions of UGC Act 1956.

Dr. Arti : How do you manage your personal and professional

life?

Col. Ruhil: At my level it a 24x7x365 days profession. Personal life comes second.

Dr. Arti : What can you tell us about your experience about the MGU?

Col. Ruhil: In MGU, as in any other institution, every day is a new learning. Every challenge is a new experience from which one learns a lot. Believe me, being among the youth (students) and matured faculty is a very satisfying experience.

Dr. Arti : What skills are required in your position on a day-to-day basis?

Col. Ruhil:

- Excellent man management.
- Good inter personal relations.
- Attitude of being helpful to all especially the students and compassion towards all.
- Good professional knowledge.
- > Ability to work long hours.

Dr. Arti : A faculty member approaches you with a serious problem. How do you proceed?

Col. Ruhil: I am convinced that if a faculty member approaches me, he/she has come with the trust that I shall be able to solve his/her problem. I consider it my sacred duty to live upto the trust with which the faculty has come to me.

I believe that any person going out of my office with a smile gives me the satisfaction that I have done a fairly good job.

Dr. Arti: How did you came to know about YBN University?

Col. Ruhil: YBN University is a well-known University of Jharkhand state. The Chancellor and Pro Chancellor are well known personalities who have done and are doing yeoman's job in spreading education among the youth of the day.






ORIENTATION PROGRAMME- M.K.I.
